NNHRC urges Navajo citizens to attend Arizona's Town Hall about this November's Ballot

SAINT MICHAELS, Navajo Nation—The Navajo Nation Human Rights Commission urges Navajo citizens to attend the State of Arizona's Town Hall about Arizona ballot propositions at the Fort Defiance Chapter House, Navajo Route 112, Fort Defiance, Navajo Nation (Ariz.) on Tuesday, October 23, 2012 at 11 a.m.

Members from the State of Arizona's Election office will hold a public meeting for those who are interested in learning about Arizona ballot propositions.

"It's imperative not only to vote but to aspire to be an informed voter," said Leonard Gorman for NNHRC about the opportunity to learn more about Arizona's ballot at Tuesday's Town Hall.
