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### **Navajo students to benefit from Summer Youth Employment funding**

**WINDOW ROCK** – During a special session held on May 17, the 23<sup>rd</sup> Navajo Nation Council unanimously voted in support of resolution CMY-51-18, which was signed into law on Thursday and provides \$2 million for the 110 chapters to hire high school and college students this summer.

Council Delegate Seth Damon (Bááháálí, Chichiltah, Manuelito, Tsé Lichíí', Rock Springs, Tsayatoh), who sponsored the bill, said the funds benefit the communities as well as Navajo students by allowing them to earn income to assist with academic and cost-of-living expenses.

“Now that the funds are approved, we look to the Office of the Controller and OMB to expedite the funds to the chapters so they can begin hiring as quickly as possible. We need all of the 110 chapters to be aware of the funding that will be available and to begin hiring students immediately,” said Delegate Damon.

The funding will be distributed to the 110 chapters based on the 50/50 formula, which requires that half of the \$2 million be distributed evenly among the 110 chapters, the other half would be distributed to the chapters based on the number of registered voters in each of the 110 chapters.


Council Delegate Tuchoney Slim, Jr. (Bodaway/Gap, Coppermine, K'ai'Bii'To, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake) said the bill may also help low-income families that are struggling to help their children pursue higher education.

“We have many parents out there who are supporting their children’s efforts to reach higher educational goals, so this funding will help those students and their parents financially,” Delegate Slim stated. “We want all of our Navajo students to succeed at every level of education.”

CMY-51-18 directs the Office of Management and Budget, the Office of the Controller, and the Division of Community Development to update the chapter summer youth employment balances within seven calendar days to allow chapters to begin hiring students as soon as possible.



RESOLUTION OF THE  
NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

23rd NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,000,000 (TWO MILLION DOLLARS) FOR SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT TO 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations.
- B. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation." 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(16).
- C. This legislation is offered as an emergency legislation due to the critical nature summer youth employment plays in the local economy as well as to the students employed by the chapters. This directly threatens the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation.
- D. The Title 12 Appropriations Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
  - 1. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
  - 2. Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at 12 N.N.C. § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating

recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).

3. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis and other appropriate actions. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).

**SECTION 2. FINDINGS**

- A. A supplemental appropriation is requested to cover the expenses of summer youth employment. The budget forms are provided in **Exhibit A**.
- B. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(L) and (F), respectively, the Office of the Controller is required to advise the Navajo Nation Council the available balance in the UUFB and to determine whether the costs are recurring.
- C. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), the Office of Management and Budget is required to provide a budget impact analysis.
- D. Distribution to Chapters shall be allocated at 50% equally to all Chapters and 50% divided proportionally among Chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each Chapter bears to the whole of registered voters. 12 N.N.C. § 820(O). Distribution form attached as **Exhibit B**.
- E. Due to the emergency nature of the legislation, OOC and OMB have not yet provided the statutorily required reviews, however, both Divisions can provide comments when the legislation is before the Navajo Nation Council.
- F. Diné Customary Law declares and teaches that: " [i]t is the right and freedom of the people that our children are provided with education to absorb wisdom, self-knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in the growth of the Navajo Nation." 1 N.N.C. § 204 (F).
- G. One way for the Navajo Nation to honor Diné Customary Law is to assist high school and college students with temporary employment.

- H. The Summer Youth Employment program offers high school and college students the opportunity to gain work experience during their summer breaks and pay some of their school expenses.
- I. The Summer Youth Employment program aligns with Diné Customary Law by providing Navajo Nation youth with "education to absorb wisdom, self-knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in the growth of the Navajo Nation." 1 N.N.C. § 204 (F).

**SECTION 3. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,000,000 (TWO MILLION DOLLARS) TO THE BUSINESS UNITS FOR THE NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS**

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$2,000,000 to the Business Unit Numbers for the Navajo Nation chapters to fund the Summer Youth Employment program.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$2,000,000 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to the Business Unit Numbers for the Navajo Nation chapters.
- C. The supplemental funding shall be distributed in accordance with the Chapter distribution formula in **Exhibit B**.

**Section 4. Effective Date**

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

**SECTION 5. DIRECTIVE TO THE NAVAJO NATION OFFICE OF THE CONTROLLER, OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET, AND DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

The Navajo Nation Departments of the Office of Management and Budget, the Office of the Controller, and the Division of Community Development are directed to update the Chapter Summer Youth Employment Fund balances within 7 calendar days of enactment pursuant to Section 4 above.



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


