Navajo President Buu Nygren invites Navajo public to 2nd Annual People’s State of the Navajo Nation Address

January 14th event to celebrate 2024 accomplishments, 2025 goals

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. – The 2nd Annual People’s State of the Navajo Nation is only days away.

“This January 14th is about being proud to be Navajo and to show what we’ve done when we think for the future,” President Nygren said.

Doors will open at Greyhills Academy High School at 7:30 a.m. on Jan. 14.

Navajo Nation President Buu Nygren will take the stage at 11 a.m. to present his comprehensive People’s State of the Navajo Nation Address.

It will cover a year’s worth of accomplishments, achievements, advancements, boosted revenues, increases in housing and much more.

The executive directors of Executive Branch divisions and departments will speak for before and after the President’s address.

Each division will have booths and staff to provide information on services and help people sign up, enroll and apply for programs and services.



“For the second time, we will showcase to the world that the Navajo Nation is continuing to move forward,” he said. “This is the time and place that gives our people pride.”

Guest speakers and entertainment will fill the morning and afternoon.

The President’s hour-long report will outline the progress and accomplishments his Administration has made in 2024, its the goals for 2025, the executive orders he’s signed over the year, and the changes made within to solve problems long-standing and increase tribal efficiency.

A lunch will be served to 2,500 people expected to attend. Entertainment will be performed between presentations, and updates will be given by the

Executive Branch division directors about how their programs are advancing.

“This will show the Navajo people, all 421,718, that they can feel great about something that big,” the President said.

Like last year, the day will celebrate what the Navajo Nation can do and is doing for the Navajo people.

President Nygren says this is an information day with speeches, booths and entertainment that they public shouldn't miss. People will learn how to apply for a homesite lease, business

site lease, veteran benefits and other services in many of the divisions. “I want the people to see our divisions and to see for themselves where our Nation is going and how they can be a part of it,” President Nygren said.

“These annual events are to remind our Navajo people that they need to feel good about who they are, where they live, to see that progress is being made and that they can be proud of their language, culture and heritage.”
