## Wildcat spirit fills the Den during 2025 Chinle High School graduation

"The enthusiasm and support that filled the Wildcat Den was remarkable. As I congratulate Chinle High's class of 2025, I also commend the teachers, parents, grandparents, friends and other support systems that pushed these graduates to the finish line in receiving their diplomas today," said Speaker Crystalyne Curley.

Speaker Curley was joined on stage by Council Delegates Shawna Ann Claw, Cherilyn Yazzie, and Germaine Simonson. Council Delegates Vince James and Eugenia Charles-Newton were also in attendance.

In the welcome address that was provided by CHS Sr. Class Treasurer Faithe Yazzie, she reiterated to her classmates that today's celebration was the culmination of late night study sessions, resilience, strength and determination. CHS Principal Dr. Raymond Andrade similarly congratulated the students for all their hard work, encouraging them to continue to push forward.

"You have done all this work to get to this point," Principal Andrade said. "This is the beginning not the end. Go and do what you were destined to do."
